Key Vocabulary and definitions

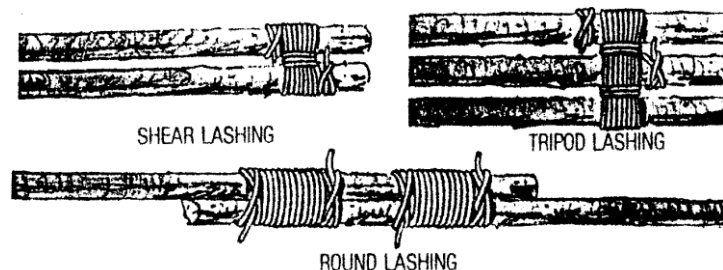
Spinney	A small wood with undergrowth.
John Muir	An American conservationist (1838-1914)
discover	To see or find something for the first time.
explore	To investigate or study something or somewhere.
conserve	To keep something in a safe state - to look after the environment.
aerial view	To see an object or area from the air.
identification	To recognise or name something by its features.
record	To write something down so that it can be read in the future.
ecosystem	A system made up of living and non-living things within an area.
biodiversity	The variety of life within an ecosystem
trust	A belief that someone or something is reliable and safe.
teamwork	To work together with other people towards a goal.
