**il n'y a pas- there is not/there aren't**

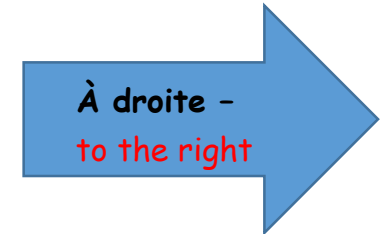
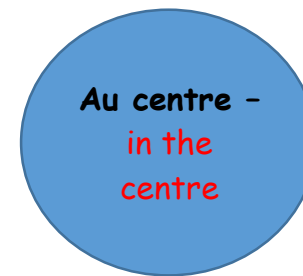
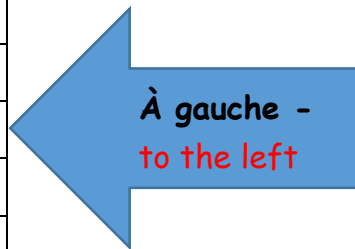
### Speaking and listening
