Stone Age	A long period of pre-history lasting roughly 2.5 million years.  Tools and weapons were made of stone, mostly flint.					
Bronze Age	Tools and weapons were made of a metal called bronze.					
Iron Age	Tools and weapons were made of a metal called iron.

weapon	An object made to harm others or fight with.					
Primary source	Something that was created in the past and has not been changed.					
Secondary source	Something created by somebody who has researched the past, but who was not there at the time.					
artefact	An object that we can use to study the past.

hunter gather	People who live by hunting, fishing and collecting food they find.  They do not live in one place.
