### What should I already know?

There are ancient civilizations.

We can use clues (sources) from the past to help us understand what life was like then.

### Key information

Ancient Greece is defined by three distinct periods:

#### Archaic Period

- Beginnings of Greek government.

- Greeks started to discover the arts such as theatre and philosophy.

**700s BCE** Establishment of city-states like Athens and Sparta.

776BCE First Olympic Games to honour the Greek god Zeus in Olympia.

**750BCE** Homer wrote two epic poems: The Iliad and Odyssey.

**570BCE** Philosopher, scientist and mathematician Pythagoras was born.

**508BCE** Democracy introduced in Athens

#### Classical Period

- Democracy introduced more widely.
- Sophocles wrote many plays.
- Philosophers Socrates, Plato and Aristotle born.

#### Hellenistic Period

- Ancient Romans began to secure power and Ancient Greece society was diminished. Ancient Greece becomes part of the Roman Empire.
