Key dates

2nd September 1945- end of World War II.

1948- British Nationality Act was introduced allowing people in the Commonwealth the right to claim British citizenship.

21st **June 1948**- the ship HMT Empire Windrush arrived at the Port of Tilbury carrying British Caribbean citizens.

1949- The NHS began to recruit staff from the Caribbean.

30th April 1963- Bristol Bus Boycott

8th November 1968- Race Relations Act law in place.

1985- first year of Leicester Caribbean Carnival.
