## What should I already know?

## Key knowledge

- Sections of music can be repeated or organised in different ways to help make the structure of a piece of music successful
- A 'red herring' in a piece of music is called the bridge - here, the structure can deviate from the regular structure of the music piece
- Many songs have verses, a chorus and a bridge
- When creating music on a digital lab, repetition is often a key feature
- Audio effects can change or alter the character of sounds or instruments or audio loops - two examples would be reverb (reverberation) and echo

## Key Vocabulary

**Musical structure** – music is often made up of sections that help to create Structure in a piece

Rhythm - a regular or irregular pattern in music

**Beats** – strokes or blows to make sounds (or rests) in a piece of music **Bar** – a section of music to do with a time signature – in a piece of music there are usually the same number of beats in each bar i.e. 4/4 time or 6/8 time **Composition** – a piece of music that has been created or composed with intent **Bridge** – an unusual section of a piece of music that doesn't follow the structure of the rest of the piece

**Verse** – a section of music that is repeated many times over – if there are words, the they change with each verse but the music generally stays exactly the same each time

**Chorus** – part of a piece of music that recurs at regular intervals, usually after each verse – also known as a refrain

Loop - a section of electronic music that is repeated within the piece Audio Effects - using technology to amend or alter the sounds in a piece of music for special effect
