PSHE

In PSHE, we have been looking at gender stereotypes, with a particular focus on jobs and career choices.

We have discussed what gender stereotypes are and thought about three jobs in particular: a nurse, a firefighter and a mechanic. Interestingly, most children initially drew a female nurse, a male firefighter and a male mechanic.

We discussed different scenarios in a school as to whether they were fair or whether they showed some gender stereotyping. It was a great, open discussion and a very interesting one! Well done everyone.



Mindfulness

Some of our children have had the wonderful opportunity to take part in some relaxation and mental health workshops. These sessions aimed to raise awareness of mental health & wellbeing support and included interactive discussions and activities. The workshops began with an introduction to the brain (explained as the wise owl and the guard dog) so that young people were able to understand how their brains work. They then designed 'happiness boxes' which we hope they have brought home to show you.

Lots of inquiry into coding and into gauging input and output helped us familiarise with Micro:bits enough to be able to make our own step counters and use them when we exercise!


Art

These art lessons will compliment our English learning, focusing on the book Dragonology: The complete book of dragons.














RE

We have been learning about Hinduism in RE. We have been learning about the history of Hinduism through the story of Rama and Sita. We know a lot about Hindu worship at home and we are now learning about worship in the Mandir and comparing the two.

Science

We have been making circuits in science. We tested the conductivity of different types of material. We made our own circuits, trouble-shooting to find out why circuits wouldn't work and how to fix them.We used electrical wires, crocodile clips, bulbs, cells and switches!

Children in Year 5 have been enjoying the challenge of filling their pom pom jars to recognise good choices throughout the day. A half full jar of pom poms is rewarded with a treat chosen by the class. This half term, we have had rewards of a Science investigation afternoon and Pyjama days with a movie afternoon. The full jar rewards are soon to come. A great incentive to be 'caught being good'.

Foundation Subjects

We have continued our topic of 4 and 6 figure grid references in geography.

The children have enjoyed looking at OS maps of Leicestershire, building on prior knowledge of rural and urban areas and are now more confident when finding specific squares on a map. However, finding 6 figure grid references have been a little tricker to master! In French we have finished our weather topic and we are now looking at shops and buildings found on a French high street. The children have worked hard on their pronunciations and identifying types of shops. Tres bien!

RE lessons have focused on Islam and it has been really good to hear personal experiences from our children who follow this faith.

Swimming

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Year 5 are fortunate to receive swimming lessons and these take place for classes at intervals throughout the year on Thursday mornings. We have all been very impressed both with the children's great behaviour and attitude in lessons. They are a credit to Overdale. As teachers, it is fascinating to see our pupils progressing, overcoming initial anxieties and supporting one another in so many ways.


Warning Zone
