

# **School Trips**

Year 1 had a pirate day at Beaumanor Hall, where utilising the pirate theme, the leaders aim to enrich the maths, literacy and history aspects of the curriculum. There were physical challenges, treasure hunts and perplexing problems to solve.

Year 2 went to the Thinktank, Birmingham's award winning science museum. They had an amazing day learning about everything from steam engines and talking robots through to gurgling guts and a chocolate wrapping machine.

Year 3 had an Egyptian day where an archaeologist, who still works in Egypt and discovered Tutankhamun's mummifying crypt, came into school and provided a bespoke experience which the children loved!

All of KS2 went to the cinema before Christmas to celebrate a successful, and long, term. Plus the whole school watched a panto on the last day of term which was great fun.

Most recently, Neil O Brien, our local MP, visited Year 5 and spoke to our children about life in politics. Year 5 also had a visit from the Mayor and experienced a mock trial, which was very well received!

# **Sporting Successes**

Our sporting achievements have continued this year with our football team beat Launde 7-1 at our last fixture and our basketball team came second in the local tournament.

SPARX club is being run again this year, alongside Primary GALS, a fun and fitness event for Key Stage 2 girls organised by Learning South Leicestershire School Sports Partnership.

# **Ofsted Visit**

We are delighted to share with you the full report from the Ofsted inspection which took place in January. We have been eagerly awaiting this for several weeks and, after a long delay, it is on the Manor High School and DfE websites.

There is a great deal of which we can be rightly proud and this is reflected in the excellent feedback from parents, pupils and staff and from the inspection team throughout the report.

We are particularly pleased with the comments made by the team about leadership and governance of the school:

- "School leaders have created a highly ambitious culture"
- "Leaders and governors have established a highly aspirational 11 to 16 school with a distinctive character and ethos".

There is recognition of how well we have led and managed the process of change and the high level of challenge we provide for our GCSE classes across Years 9-11:

- "Governors and school leaders have managed the change of age range exceptionally well, taking the local community with them"
- "Teachers prepare pupils well for examinations".

Our curriculum and high level of challenge feature prominently:

- "A demanding, well-taught curriculum helps pupils of different abilities to make strong progress and attain well"
- "Leaders are committed to providing a first-class standard of education for pupils"
- "The school's wider curriculum makes a strong contribution to pupils' personal development".

Unsurprisingly, the inclusiveness and ethos of our school are strongly evidenced in the report and this is what makes Manor High School unique:

- "Pupils are proud of their school"
- "Leaders have created a positive climate for learning. The school is a calm place"
- "Pupils from a wide range of backgrounds come together as a single community".

Our pastoral systems and admissions processes were also praised for supporting our new students:

- "The school has excellent transition arrangements. Pupils, including those with SEND, get off to a flying start at secondary school"
- "The school's tutoring arrangements mean that pupils of different ages socialise and work together. Younger children find this very reassuring"
- "The house system promotes healthy competition and develops pupils' resilience"
- "Pupils transferring to the school settle in quickly".

Enjoy reading the report and thank you for the role that you have played in maintaining excellence and high levels of expectation in our school.



# **A Warm Welcome Awaits**

March 1st is always an exciting day in our calendar, as it is when we find out who our new Year 7 intake will be. Each year our intake changes, with students gaining places at our school from near and far. However, we are always delighted to see students from the Oak MAT schools.

We held our first welcome event on Thursday 21 March, where we introduced the school to all our new students and families. Our Head Boy and Girl spoke to the families, along with senior leaders and some of our current Year 7 students. Every child was given a welcome pack in a handy drawstring bag (perfect for PE kits) and our senior and pastoral leaders were on hand to chat to all.

We had some lovely feedback from our new families:

Our next event is our Transition Evening in May, where our staff spend time with each student getting to know them; their likes, dislikes, their friends and interests. This relaxed and friendly evening which is central to ensure a seamless transition to secondary school.

Our final event for this academic year, is our Induction Days when our new students join us for three fun-packed days where they are immersed in Manor High School life. They meet their new tutor groups, spend time in lessons with specialist teachers and then participate in our annual sports day. This is the first chance for our new students to influence the house competition and contribute to who wins the house cup.

Our new transition cycle starts again in September when we commence our regular Open Mornings and hold our annual Open Evening, where we showcase the school to primary children in the area. This is always an amazing night where students can get involved in hands-on experiments, food tastings, competitions and more. Dates will be confirmed shortly so watch this space!

# **Wellbeing Award**

As a school we are proud to be working towards achieving the Wellbeing Award for Schools, which has been developed in partnership with the National Children's Bureau (NCB). The award is intended to help schools prepare and equip themselves to promote emotional wellbeing and positive mental health across the whole-school community.

The vision is to create an education system where good emotional wellbeing and mental health are at the heart of the culture and ethos of our school, so that our pupils, with the support of their teachers, can build confidence and flourish.

Gaining this award will help Manor High to ensure that highly effective provision is in place at our school to promote the emotional wellbeing and mental health of both staff and pupils. Evidence shows us that wellbeing is of central importance to learning and attainment, with high levels of wellbeing associated with improved academic outcomes.

As a school, we are proud of the many initiatives we already offer students. We promote positive mental health and wellbeing for everyone. Embarking on the award process demonstrates we recognise the needs and demands of our school are changing and we remain committed to responding to these.

# **GCSE Preparations**

Manor High is just weeks away from an historic occasion in our 11-16 journey. In the 50th anniversary year, our first set of GCSEs will be sat by our first ever Year 11 cohort in May and June. Our preparations have been second to none, ensuring any gaps in knowledge have been filled and that every student is well supported both academically and emotionally for what the exams will bring.

Our preparations are not limited to Year 11 though. We work hard throughout each child's five year journey from Year 7 to Year 11 to ensure mastery in each subject and a positive attitude to learning. Our wide-ranging extra-curricular activities support each child's education and are designed to inspire and encourage in-depth knowledge. Our pastoral systems, including the PiXL Edge LORIC programme, ensure our students focus on their character building skills, including organisation, resilience and initiative, from the outset.

We know that success at Year 11 means focus and attention in every year of secondary education, not just Key Stage 4. We know all our students and that is what gives us the #MagicofManor.

# **Immersive Classrooms**

Recently Year 1 turned their classrooms into different rooms of a space centre in order to allow the children to be fully immersed in a space environment. This was inspired by our

recent Talk for Writing training where you start each writing module with a hook to inspire the children and improve the quality of their writing. All the schools in the OAK MAT have worked together on a writing moderation project with a space theme.



# **RE Story Week**

In February we held our first R.E story week, each day the classes shared stories from different faiths. The week was very successful and helped to promote R.E, and celebrate diversity within our school. We also had a visit from the vicar of St Mary's church and a number of parents who shared R.E stories with the school in assembly. Following the children's work around R.E stories each class The children produced some art work which related to stories they had read and we used these stories as a theme for our corridor displays.

# **Eco-Schools Green Flag**

Mrs Howard and our school have been awarded the coveted Green Flag. The Eco-Schools Green Flag is an internationally recognised award for excellence in environmental action and learning. Our Eco club have worked really hard to encourage the school and the wider community to take care of the environment. Eco club wanted to reduce the use of plastics

within school and identified the milk bottles and straws as a possible way to do this. They supported a change in milk supplier who have provided the school with cups so we no longer need to use plastic straws. Our milk is also delivered in larger milk bottles instead of individual milk bottles and has significantly reduced the use of plastic in school. # Science Week

As part of our Science week celebrations KS1 had a visit from JuniorSTEM! They took part in a hands-on Cool Cars workshop where they learnt how to make a car and a spinning machine using Lego WeDo and motors. During the sessions, our children had the opportunity to use and apply their coding skills. Parents and carers were invited to take part in the sessions and the workshops were very well attended.

Our children in Foundation Stage have taken part in story based sessions with Sphere Science. The theme for Science week this year is Terrific Transport and we have had several visits from people in the community who work within the field of transport and science.

# **New Pre-School**

The privately run pre-school on the Overdale site, formerly know at The Willows, was taken over by the Trust and re-opened as the Overdale Pre-School at the beginning of the 2018/19 academic year. A very recent capital investment has significantly improved the pre-school grounds and the staff work closely with the Infant school, who have educational oversight of the setting, to help maintain and improve the quality of the provision.

### **Maths Marvels**

Our current maths practice has been noticed on Twitter and this led to the school being contacted by Sharon Grinham from Oxford Owl University, with the prospect of becoming an advocate school for Numicon.

On Tuesday 5th March, we had a Numicon focused maths session, where Sharon came to discuss maths and see our practice with a particular interest in our concrete-pictorial-abstract approach. It was fantastic to see: Year 3 learning about fraction of amounts; Year 4 learning about decimals; Year 5 learning about finding areas of rectilinear shapes and Year 6 exploring ratio.

As well as this, we have been trialling 'Plickers' which we were able to showcase in two classrooms. This enables teachers to get instant feedback on misconceptions the children may have. This technology blew Mr Evans' mind when he saw it in practice in 5D. Our visitor was extremely impressed with the attitude towards learning and the outcomes our mixed ability sets are providing for the children. Thank you to Mr Ellis, Miss Smith and staff for your continued dedication to raising standards and the profile of maths across the school.

# **EcOverdale**

At Overdale Junior School, we are trying to look at the environment: both locally and around the world. We are working with Eco Schools to be sustainable in all areas of our school's life. Recently, we obtained our silver award and earned our second Green Flag as part of Eco Schools at the end of November 2018

EcOverdale, our eco committee, have been as busy as ever this school year. Many of EcOverdale's activities are going on

behind the scenes but there are a number of new initiatives that we hope you are aware of and taking part in. Did you know we have schemes to recycle your old pens and crisp packets for example? We also have Two-Wheeler Tuesday every week and are taking part in Big Pedal day!
