Fabulous Foundation Subjects!

We have been learning about lots of different topics in all of our foundation subjects.

In science, we have been learning about living things and classification. In history, we have been looking at Anglo Saxons. Geography found us learning about Europe. We have been learning about facial features in French.

In art, we have been studying portraiture and looked at the work of specific artists: Picasso, Hockney and Freud. We have had a go at drawing our own self-portraits with some wonderful results!



Remarkable RE!

We will learn about many different religions in our RE syllabus this year. We have started with Christianity, learning about the Holy Trinity. We have many questions about Christianity and the Holy Trinity and are trying to find answers as we learn. We have invited Reverend Jones in to meet with us at the end of the unit – to show him what we have learned, but also to find out the answers to questions we still have!

In PSHE we have started the yearbooking at friendships; how we can make friends and keep friends but most importantly, how we can be a good friend to others. These discussions go hand in hand with our character curriculum values and attributes of respect, responsibility and resilience.



We have had a great start to the school year in Year 5 and have been working hard on our character curriculum to ensure we are ready for learning and are modelling our core values throughout school! We have thoroughly embraced the focus on our values and are earning Pom Poms to celebrate our achievements with some great reward activities planned in each class!

5S and 5PM have started the year with a weekly swimming session, which has been fantastic in developing confidence in the water for many of the children and enabling our more confident swimmers to continue to develop their swimming and water safety skills! We look forward to 5LW and 5S starting their swimming next half term.

In Science this half term we have been developing our scientific skills through research and questioning and predicting. We dissected flowers to identify the reproductive parts which was super interesting and got all of the children's scientific minds flowing!



In writing, we have been working very hard on our descriptive language techniques and have explored description across a range of texts. In geography, we have started our topic on 4 and 6 figure grid references. We know that 4 figure grid references help us to find specific areas on a map and we've compared aerial photos of Knighton with simple OS maps. The children enjoyed finding the school, Knighton park and even some of their homes!

So far this year in History, we have been looking at the Ancient Greeks and their influence on our world today. We have plotted key achievements on a timeline and enjoyed a time machine element to our learning to focus our mind on how far back they lived! Theatres were a brilliant Greek creation and we used our listening skills to identify key characteristics of their structure - it was a great lesson full of creative ideas! The Olympic games has been another element of our discovery, discussing similarities and differences between what they were like back in Ancient Greece and how we enjoy watching and playing them today.

In PSHE we have focused on belonging and beginning a new year with different people. We stared by introducing ourselves and finding out what different people liked, to help build some new friendships. We then identified and explored how someone might feel in a new situation and how we can help them navigate their way through some things that they might think or feel. In our learning we made games to demonstrate our ideas and strategies about how to cope in new situations and build resilience (which is one of our school values!).

A lovely start to the year in Year 5 and we can't wait to see what next half term brings!

Reading

Overdale Junior School *

> All children in year six have chosen two reading books: one book at an appropriate level for them to access, while providing some challenge, and a second book chosen to read for enjoyment. Regular reading at home provides amazing benefits for children's vocabulary, their comprehension skills and their ability to empathise with others.

> We encourage children to read at home for twenty minutes, five times a week. This could be a fiction reading book, but it could also be a magazine, comic book, instruction manual...anything!

In class, we have been reading *Over the Line* and *Can I Build Another Me?* The books relate to our history and art theme of World War I and our PHSE theme of Friends and Family.
