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Lovely Lowry Art.

This half term, we have been working towards some lovely art work inspired by Lowry. The children have had to think very carefully about everything that they have learned this half term in order to produce some fabulous art work which looks very much like Lowry's work!

We have worked on a range of things such as perspective, realism, colour mixing, painting and drawing.



English Counties

This half term, we have also been learning about English counties.

The children have been using a map of all of the counties to identify the different ones and find them on a map.

Food routes.

In 'Food Routes', the children have been making tasty chilli bean potatoes. They have learned how to create this wonderful meal and worked hard to scoop out the potato, mash it, add tomatoes, chives, paprika & cheese then rebaked it in the oven. Most children ate everything - including the skin!





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YEAR 4

Introduction to iPads!

Year 4 have adjusted really well to the addition of iPads to help us with our learning. They have begun to show a level of independence in accessing their iPad and have demonstrated the level of care required to look after the device. We are practising using the stylus pen for writing – it can be tricky to do it neatly!



Portraiture/Cubism in Art!



Year 4 have learnt about a famous artist named Pablo Picasso and we have been investigating his techniques to create our own cubism portrait - with a focus on his double portrait. The children were able to follow step by step instructions, to recreate a cubism portrait. They then used pencil crayons and added bright colours to their finished piece.

Investigating living things!

In science, we have learnt about living things and have looked at grouping plants and animals, by following a classification key. We have also recapped what makes something living and non-living. In between the rain showers, year 4 have had the opportunity to explore our school grounds for living things and found lots of different flowers, insects, small animals, ferns and mosses and trees. We used a Leaf ID to identify leaves too!

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YEAR 5

What a great start to the year!

The children have come back to school this half term absolutely raring to go. Year 5, we are all so proud of you!

In English, the children have started drafting and editing their writing about a city. The focus in English has been to discover how authors create humour in their writing – which has been brilliant as it has meant that Year 5 have also had some giggles whilst learning how to hone their craft.



iPads and swimming

The children across the school are loving using the iPAds in the classrooms. They are becoming very good at remembering the school iPads routines and demonstrating sensible use of the devices.

We have been so impressed by the perseverance and determination shown by the children in Year 5, not just with their iPads but also in their swimming lessons and they have made amazing progress already.

Life cycles

The children have looked at the life cycles of frogs and butterflies and have created atmosphere, in groups, in their music lessons.

We also had some fun for European languages day - singing a well known song in German and doing a cheese hunt!

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YEAR 6

English

Year 6 have worked very hard this half term in English. We have been practicing writing a range of sentences including simple, complex and compound using the picture book, 'Can I build another me?' by Shinsuke Yoshitake. We used this to help us write a non –chronological report about ourselves where we discussed our achievements, what makes us proud and our hobbies and interests. After this unit, we then read 'Over the Line' by Tom Palmer where we learnt more about life during World War One and living in the trenches.

Maths

In Maths, we have recapped our knowledge of place value and worked with larger numbers up to 10,000,000. We learned how to round decimals to the nearest decimal place. In addition to this, we have worked on our arithmetic skills through assessments. We then used this to address misconceptions or recap how to solve certain problems during short arithmetic lessons.

<u>Reading</u>

During the first few weeks of school, we ensured we had the correct reading book for our reading level. This was why completing the STAR reading test was important to ensure the ZPD level that the program provided us was an accurate picture of our reading. Once completing the book, we have been using iPads to take quizzes to demonstrate our understanding of what we have read.



Visit from Mr Croucher

Year 6 had a fantastic visit from Mr Croucher from Manor High School, who came to share all the exciting opportunities awaiting them at secondary school. The pupils were inspired as they learned about the new experiences and challenges ahead. They also demonstrated great resilience and creativity while making paper aeroplanes and testing their designs by flying them across the hall, turning the activity into a fun and engaging learning experience!

Wider Curriculum

Our History topic has been World War One where we have learnt about the reasons for the outbreak of the war as well as some of the weapons that were used during the war. We also learnt about how women made a huge contribution to the war effort while men had to fight on the war front. Alongside this, in Art, we explored war artists such as Paul Nash and discussed why certain artists would have been commissioned to create pieces of artwork for the government. When looking closely at these pieces, we found that colour, line, tone and shape played a pivotal part in creating mood and atmosphere.



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MUSIC

Young Voices

Rehearsals are well underway for our Young Voices concert.

Over 50 children from Year 5 and 6 are meeting after school on Mondays with Ms Gamble and Mrs Lawton-Weale to get ready for the big event.

Young Voices takes place in many venues across the country and Overdale Junior School Choir travel to the Resorts World Arena in Birmingham. Our concert is on January 15th and we will sing with around 6,000 other school children to an audience of thousands.

This event is a highlight of the musical calendar every year.













In School

We have started weekly ukulele lessons in Year 4 with the fabulous Mr Stevens from Leicestershire Music.

In Year 6, our students are learning how to Beatbox like pros!

In Spring Term, Year 5 will learn turntablism and Year 3 recorder.

Our weekly singing assemblies are a joy. We are definitely a singing school!
