Curriculum Reading

Our curriculum reading programme focuses on developing essential reading skills through a carefully planned and mapped approach.

Key features of our curriculum reading offer include:

- ✓ Daily 30-minute reading lessons focused on practicing and reinforcing specific reading skills, such as comprehension, fluency, and vocabulary.
- ✓ Daily 1:1 reading time with our first 5% of readers and regular reading time with our first 20% of readers
- ✓ Use of the Accelerated Reader Scheme to provide students with books that are both challenging and engaging, helping them to build confidence and progress in their reading.
- ✓ Access to a diverse library selection which reflects the different cultures, interest and experiences of the children in our school, with texts chosen by the students themselves through regular pupil voice exercises.

Reading for Pleasure

We place a strong emphasis on reading for enjoyment, knowing that a love of books contributes to lifelong learning.

Key features of our reading for pleasure offer include:

- ✓ A weekly reading-for-pleasure lesson: This dedicated slot allows students to engage in “book talk” with peers, where they discuss their current reading, share recommendations, and explore new titles.
- ✓ 10-minute daily class story time: Every day, teachers read aloud a story to the class, fostering a shared reading experience and sparking students’ imaginations.
- ✓ 15 minutes of daily silent reading: Each day, students have time for independent reading, allowing them to immerse themselves in a book.
- ✓ Celebration of reading achievements at home each week in our whole-school celebration assembly
- ✓ Engagement with national events such as World Book Day and National Storytelling Week, and local initiatives, such as Leicester’s Our Best Book.
